CELEBRATING AUSTRALIA DAY – MONDAY 20 JANUARY 2025

This year a number of concerned citizens will be celebrating Australia Day 2025 on Monday 20 January – the second last Monday of the month.

They are doing so as they no longer feel that it is appropriate to celebrate the nation on 26 January, a date that marks the dispossession of our First Nations peoples and the commencement of British colonisation.

In a recent article 'Historians recommend moving Australia Day away from January 26' news.com.au 3 Jan 25, ANU historian Professor Angela Woollacott states that "the debate around January 26 will go on forever and the only way to just clear the deck is to have a new date." CQUniversity historian Dr Benjamin Jones agrees and poses the question "Is there a possible alternative?"

The answer to that in our view is YES.

"We all need a time and date once a year when we can come together in a respectful and joyous way – wouldn't it be good if it was over a long weekend that allows plenty of time to celebrate, reflect and relax?" asks Phil Jenkyn OAM, a retired barrister and community activist.

"We believe that the best time for Australia Day is the second last Monday in January as part of an Australia Long Weekend."

"The proposed time is about two-thirds of the way through January, it will always predate 26 January and is simply the best time of the year for such a celebration," says James Woods, businessman and lawyer.

"We have created a website and a petition and have consulted widely over the last six months. We are now seeking the support of the Australian people for this proposal."
